COASTAL SCHOOL RECONSTRUCTION

Alban Lower Primary School is a coastal school in Kara, mostly serving the fishermen kids. Established in the year 1903, the school has 8 classrooms with 168 students and 9 teachers. The classroom buildings were more than 100 years old and needed reconstruction. The school got partial funding from Kerala Government's tsunami funds for the reconstruction but still needed close to 8 lakhs (appx \$16,000). Care & Share supporters came forward to support the reconstruction with a contribution of \$4000. The construction is expected to be completed by May 2013.

Saptaswara is a Seattle based nonprofit music troop whose mission is helping charitable organizations to raise funds for their projects.
